NCM website... There is a wealth of information available on the NCM website (https://www.corvettemuseum.org/). At the top of the home page is a drop-down button which is labeled "Membership". One of the options included under that tab is information about the benefits and costs of the various levels of membership. Of interest to current NCM members is the "Members Only" link. After setting up a username and password, a member has access to a great deal of information that is only accessed through that page. Details about your membership, including join date and contact information can be seen. Members can even print out a new membership card via the Members Only page.

So what's all this "tracking your car" talk about?...Let's say that you don't really want to take your car out on the track. Or let's say that you are a little bit squeamish about driving one of the NCM Motorsports Park's cars. RECIPE OF THE MONTH! No Churn Key Lime Ice Cream



We have here the perfect dessert to cool the summertime heat. It takes one of my all-time favorite taste treats, key lime pie, and turns it into ice cream. Plus (and this is a big plus) it is so, so easy! Making an ice cream buffet? Add another flavor - No Churn Chocolate Ice Cream, which uses the same method only, well, chocolate. You'll find in in the recipe tab under desserts.



Ingredients:

- 2 cups heavy whipping cream
- 1 can sweetened condensed milk
- 1/2 cup Key Lime juice (not regular lime, must be Key Lime Kroger's carries it)
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

Directions:

- Stir together sweetened condensed milk, key lime juice and vanilla in a medium bowl. Set aside.
- In separate bowl, whip heavy cream until stiff peaks form (do not over beat.)
- Fold all of the whipped cream into the sweetened milk mixture until even, smooth texture. (Be gentle don't beat or over-mix)
- Pour into a 2 quart container, cover with plastic wrap and freeze for at least 6 hours or overnight. A 9-x-5 loaf pan works perfectly for this.

Susan's Notes:

• Serve your ice cream with a graham cracker or crumble a few graham crackers and use them as toppings, and you will officially have created a "deconstructed" Key Lime Pie!
